NOTES

Hotel rooms — The Crowne Plaza has both standard rooms and also suites. By default, our online registration process books you in a mini-suite. The suites have no kitchen area, per se, but the hotel can provide a microwave at an additional charge (\$15/day). All rooms come with a refrigerator.

Breakfast/lunch/dinner daily —

Meals are not included in your conference or hotel registrations. When you go through the LCJE-NA webpage (www.lcje-na.org) to make your reservation, however, you will receive vouchers upon your arrival for a discounted rate (\$7) on the daily breakfast buffet (the regular price is \$12.99). The only exception is the cost of the Wednesday night banquet, which is covered in the cost of your conference registration. The hotel has a restaurant on-site, but no other restaurants are within easy walking distance; however, a wide variety of dining options are available within the three-mile radius serviced by the hotel shuttle. Monte (hotel guest services) recommends that you make a reservation in advance for the hotel shuttle because their first priority is servicing DFW airport (see below).

Airport transportation — As we mentioned above, the hotel shuttle service provides transportation to or from DFW Airport. Upon your arrival at DFW, please call the hotel at (817) 394-5000 to make arrangements for pickup. The service is available only for DFW Airport—not Love Field. If you prefer, taxi service is readily available at the airport at an estimated cost of \$47 - \$57 (including tip). Uber and Lyft services are also available.

Cost for the breakfast will be \$7 plus tip (bring your breakfast voucher), and we are also requesting a donation of \$10 to help cover the room rental fee (\$17 total).
