NOTES

Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner daily – Meals other than the closing banquet on Wednesday night are not included in the registration fee. The Town & Country Resort and Convention Center (TCRCC), however, has several on-site eateries — and it's next door (literally) to a shopping mall with an expansive and diverse food court.

Airport pickup – TCRCC does not operate an airport shuttle, so they recommend either Cloud 9 Shuttle or Xpress Shuttle. Both are easy to access at the airport and take about 20 minutes to get you to the hotel. More info at this website: www.cloud9shuttle.com

Our conference facility is located about 7 miles from the San Diego airport. The shuttle costs approximately \$12.00 per person each way. A cab would be around \$20.00 each way.

Airport return – For your return trip to the airport, the bellmen are happy to make a shuttle reservation if you'll let them know (ideally) 24 hours in advance. Shuttles leave for the airport throughout the day, but they recommend an advance reservation to guarantee your seat.

Sightseeing – There's much to see and do in the San Diego area (see the "Maps and Directions" page on the resort website)! However, we have not allocated time in our conference schedule for sightseeing. If you're interested in a tour, please plan to arrive either a day or two early or to stay a day or two after the conference is over. The staff at TCRCC can assist you with touring arrangements. Discounted tickets are available for attractions like Sea World and the world-famous San Diego Zoo.

Transportation around town – There's a light-rail trolley that stops at TCRCC throughout the day and follows a route that includes many local sights and attractions in the San Diego area. For more info, consult the staff when you arrive.
